Mr. Soller successfully argued on behalf of Appellants in the Pennsylvania Supreme Court case of *Schwartz v. Rocky*, 593 Pa. 536; 932 A.2d 885; 2007 Pa. LEXIS 2177, which defined the standard for an award of treble damages under the Pennsylvania Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law, as well as establishing the standard in Pennsylvania for the election of damages versus equitable remedies.

He is a member of the American, Federal Circuit, Pennsylvania, Ohio, New York and Allegheny County Bar Associations. In addition, he is a founding member of the Western District of Pennsylvania Intellectual Property Inn of Court and is also a member of the American Intellectual Property Law Association and the Pittsburgh Intellectual Property Law Association.
